

**Due to the events of 9-11 some entries in this guide may not apply.  
Many directions begin by exiting the back gate, which at present is an “Entrance Only” gate.  
Please plan accordingly.**

## **POST OPERATIONS**

- Claremont Road is now the only ENTRANCE to post. You will pass through a security check before entering post. Allow for extra time.
- The Route 11 gate is now EXIT only, and all vehicles must enter by the Claremont gate on a 24-hour basis.
- All visitors should be prepared to show identification, vehicle registration and proof of insurance. Allow extra time to enter post.
- If you exit post **FOR ANY REASON** (bike, jog, walk, etc.) ensure you have proper identification to re-enter.
- The use of bicycles and car-pooling is encouraged.
- A parking area has been established across the street from the rear gate. Look for signs upon turning into the post golf complex.
- All post facilities are open for operations, including Dunham Health Clinic, the post dental clinic, and the post golf course.
- Dependent children under 10 living on post are not required to have an identification card if they go off post, then come back on. They'll simply be asked their name.
- Parking in the lots of nearby businesses and walking onto post is unauthorized.


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## WELCOME and ENJOY!

# CHAPTER 1


## GETTING AROUND

### HOW DO I GET TO CARLISLE BARRACKS?

Carlisle Barracks is strategically located 18 miles west of Harrisburg, 184 miles east of Pittsburgh, 109 miles west of Philadelphia, 75 miles north of Baltimore and about 90 miles north of Washington D.C. It is located near the intersection of Interstate 81 and the Pennsylvania Turnpike (76), in the South Central section of Pennsylvania.

### Directions from Harrisburg International Airport

As you leave Harrisburg International Airport, go over the bridge and stay on that road for approximately 2 miles. Bear left toward Harrisburg on Route 283. Stay on Route 283 until you see a sign for the PA Turnpike. Pick-up toll ticket and proceed toward Pittsburgh. Stay on the turnpike until you come to Exit 16. As you leave the tollbooth, bear right and proceed toward Carlisle on Route 11 South. Stay on Route 11. At the fourth traffic light make a left turn and you are on Carlisle Barracks.



### Directions from Washington, D. C.

From Washington, D. C., take Route 270 North to Frederick, MD, then Route 15 North past Gettysburg, and then the following:

- on 15 in Dillsburg, look for 74 left at light, at Getty Gas Station. Sign just before is YELLOW stoplight sign and arrow to the left toward Carlisle.
- about 10 miles, you will see Mayapple Golf Course on your left...take the next right onto Fairview
- Fairview turns into Claremont Drive after Trindle Road (Route 641)
- turn left onto Claremont Road
- at first light on Claremont Road, turn right into back gate to Carlisle Barracks

#### *Alternate Route:*

From Washington, D. C., take Route 270 North to Frederick, MD, then Route 15 North past Gettysburg, and then the following:

- the Pennsylvania Turnpike West to Exit 16
- immediately after the tollbooth, bear to the right onto Route 11 and proceed to the fourth stoplight. Turn left into the front gate of Carlisle Barracks.


### Directions from Baltimore / Washington International Airport, Baltimore, MD

Leave BWI on I-195. Go to I-95 and head north to Baltimore. Take I-695 west/north for approximately 17 miles. Take I-83 north toward York, PA. Travel approximately 62 miles. Take I-76 (PA Turnpike) west toward Pittsburgh for approximately 16 miles. Take Exit 16. Immediately after the tollbooth, bear to the right onto Route 11 and proceed to the third stoplight. Turn left into the front gate of Carlisle Barracks.

## DIRECTIONS TO THE BALTIMORE VEHICLE PROCESSING CENTER:

The Vehicle Processing Center is operated by the government contractor Pasha Group, located at 2501 Broening Highway, approximately 1 mile from the Dundalk Marine Terminal.

FROM THE NORTH: From I-83, enter the Baltimore Beltway (I-695 East) and proceed to Exit 33. Exit onto I-95 South. Stay on I-95 South for approximately 3.5 miles. At this point, the interstate splits. Follow the signs to East Baltimore and the truck route to S. E. Baltimore and Marine Terminal signs. Stay on I-95 to Keith Ave. (Exit 56.) At the first intersection after you exit, turn left on Keith Ave. Follow Keith Ave. for about .8 miles until it empties onto Broening Highway. Continue on Broening Highway to the second traffic light, through entrance of the Dundalk Marine Terminal. Turn left into the Vehicle Processing Center.



FROM THE NORTHEAST: Remain on I-95 South Baltimore / Washington until Keith Ave. (Exit 56.) Then follow the same directions as from the north.

FROM THE WEST: Approaching Baltimore on I-70, exit onto I-695 South (Baltimore Beltway) at the Baltimore / Glen Burnie exit (Exit 91A). Follow signs to Key Bridge / Dundalk. Cross the Key Bridge and take the first exit after the tollbooth (Exit 44, Dundalk Ave.) Turn left at the bottom of the exit ramp, and follow Broening Highway (it forks to the left at the second light). Continue to the fourth traffic light (just across the Colgate Creek Bridge) and turn right into the Pasha Facility.

FROM THE SOUTH: From I-295 north, take I-695 Glen Burnie exit and follow I-695 to Key Bridge / Dundalk. After crossing the Key Bridge, follow signs to the MTMC Vehicle Processing Point, follow the same directions as those from the west.

FROM I-95 NORTH: After passing through the Fort McHenry Tunnel, take the first exit after the tollbooth (Exit 56, Keith Ave.) Then, follow the same directions as those from the north. Fort McHenry Tunnel, Key Bridge, JFK Memorial Highway, J. Hat Bridge and Harbor Tunnel have tolls.

## GETTING ACQUAINTED WITH CARLISLE:

DRIVING TOUR OF CARLISLE: PLEASE NOTE: \_Presently for security reasons you will exit out the front gate so take a left out the front gate, left at light, left onto North St. and begin on Spring Garden Rd.

Take a right out the back gate, (near the PX) onto *North Street*. (Left is Claremont Rd, right is North Street, but it is still the same road.) Take a left onto *Spring Garden Road* (just past the lumberyard and the Mulch Man sign). Take a left at the stoplight and pass **Blockbuster Video** on your right. At the next light the road forks, Trindle Road is straight ahead (as is an entrance to I-81 North) and York Road forks to the right (where you'll find an entrance to I-81 South). Continue straight on Trindle and you will see **McDonald's** and the **Carlisle Plaza Mall (BonTon)** on your right. Take the first entrance into the Mall complex and go straight through to the light. Take a right here in front of **Office Max** onto *York Road*. Follow York as it brings you back onto *Trindle Road* (also known as High Street), take a left at this light.

At the next stoplight, take a left onto *Spring Garden Road*, go through the stop sign at *E. Pomfret Street* continue another 2 blocks to **Carlisle Marketplace Plaza (Giant)**. Turn around here and head back down Spring Garden, take a left at the stop sign onto *E. Pomfret St.* Turn left at the 2<sup>nd</sup> stop sign onto *S. Bedford Street* and right onto *E. South Street*. You will see a cemetery straight ahead and a red schoolhouse, **LeTort Elementary**, off to your left. Continue straight a few more streets and make a left onto *Hanover*, the main street through downtown Carlisle, also called Route 34, at this point.

Follow Hanover a few blocks, Wendy's is on the left (get in the right hand lane). At the 2<sup>nd</sup> light you will see the **MJ Mall** on your right (also **TSC Farm Home Auto Store**) and **Lamberton Middle School** on the left. Take a right onto *Noble Blvd*. The **MJ Mall** and **Cinemas** will be on your left. Take a right at the stop sign onto *S. West Street*. You will see **Dairy Queen** on your left and **CVS Pharmacy** and **AAA** on your right. At the next light, take a left onto *Walnut Bottom Rd*, take a hard left as the road kind of doubles back. A straight left will put you onto *W. Willow Street*.


Along Walnut Bottom you will see another entrance to **I-81 (both N and S), McDonalds, Super 8, Holiday Inn, Bonanza** and a strip mall on your left (which houses the office where you can take the PA Driver's test). Further ahead on Walnut Bottom Road is a **Member's First Credit Union** (like on Post), **K-Mart** and **Staples**. Turn around here and head back down *Walnut Bottom Road*.

Just before you reach the point where Walnut Bottom curves to the right, there will be a "Y" in the road, take the "Y" to the left onto College Street (you will see the blue and white H sign directing you to the hospital). Make a left onto *Walnut Street*, go three blocks and you will see the **Carlisle Hospital** on your right. Make a right at the stop sign onto *Wilson Street* which is not marked but "T's" out; you will see the parking lot on the left and main entrance on the right. At the stop sign, take a right onto *W. South Street* and an immediate left onto *Parker Street*. At the stop sign make a right onto the other main street through Carlisle - *High Street*. You are in the middle of the **Dickinson College** campus. Notice there is a street crossing with flashing lights for the students, go slowly and pay close attention - it is the driver's responsibility to stop and let pedestrians cross.

Take the next left at the stoplight onto *College Street*. Follow College through the North Street light (If you took a right here you would end up once again at the back gate of Carlisle Barracks), across the railroad tracks, down to the brick factory building on your right (one block past "A" St). You'll see signs for 74 North, take a left onto *74 North (also called "B" St)* which becomes *Wagonner Gap Road*. Further down on the left you will see **Bellaire Elementary School**. Turn left immediately after the school (between Bellaire and **Wilson Middle School**) onto *Bellaire Drive*, which will take you past the High School Football Stadium and sports fields. On your right will be **Carlisle High School** and ahead on the left is the **Schwartz Building** which houses classes for the 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> graders. Turn right at the end of the road onto *Penn Street*.

Follow this road in front of the High School curving to the left and you will come to the *North St* intersection. Take a left at the stop sign and follow North St all the way back to *Hanover Street*. Take a left at the light onto Hanover (known here as Route 11).

Continue on Hanover, veering right. At the second stoplight take a left onto *Clay Street* (right will be *N. Bedford*.) **Stanwix Apartments** which is used for military housing is one block on the right and **Hamilton Elementary** will be one block further. Notice **Carlisle Fairgrounds** to your right; at the stoplight take a left onto *Carlisle Springs Road* to return to Hanover St. Make a left onto *Hanover* at the light, continue until you come to the front gate of **Carlisle Barracks**. Take a right at the light, **Sunnyside Restaurant** and the **Carlwynne Manor Apartments** will be on the left. Welcome back, hope you now have your bearings!



#### **INTERSTATE DIRECTIONS TO / FROM CARLISLE BARRACKS:**

**TO I-81 North** (Mechanicsburg, Harrisburg) --- Take a left out the back gate onto Claremont Road. Turn right onto Claremont Drive, right at the light onto High Street. Entrance to I-81 N is on your left.

**TO I-81 South** (Chambersburg) --- Take a right out the back gate onto North Street, turn left onto N. Spring Garden Road, turn left at the light onto High St. When you reach the Y, veer right onto York Road, entrance to I-81 South will be on your right.

**FROM I-81 North** – Exit 49 (High Street) -- Turn right off the exit (toward Mechanicsburg). At the light turn left (Claremont Road). At the end of Claremont turn left, back gate will be on your right.

**FROM I – I-81 South** – Exit 48 (York Road) – Turn left off the exit (toward Carlisle). You will be on York Road. At the light turn left onto Trindle Road/ High Street. At the next light turn right at Taco Bell, at the 2<sup>nd</sup> stop sign turn right. The back gate will be on the left.

#### **DIRECTIONS FROM CARLISLE BARRACKS TO THE PENNSYLVANIA TURNPIKE :**

Take a right out of the front gate, go 2 miles, entrance is on the right.

**DIRECTIONS TO THE AIRPORTS:**

**Harrisburg International Airport** --- allow 45 minutes


Take the Turnpike heading east (toward Philadelphia) to Exit 19 and get in the right tollbooth lane. Take the immediate exit to the right - following signs to airport. Proceed until you come to Route 283, bear right and stay on Route 283 for approximately 1 mile, get off and you are on Route 441, signs guide the way. Go two miles and bear left, you will come to a stop sign. Terminal is straight ahead.

**Baltimore / Washington International Airport** --- allow 2 - 2 1/2 hours

Take the Turnpike heading east (toward Philadelphia). Get off at Exit 18 onto I-83 South toward York. Take I-83 all the way to Baltimore. At I-695 go west and take the outer ring to I-95 South toward D. C. Exit onto I-195 following airport signs.

**Washington / Dulles International Airport** --- allow 2 1/2 - 3 hours

Take a right out the back gate onto North Street, left onto Spring Garden Road, left at the light onto High Street. When you reach the Y, veer right onto York Road / Route 74 South. Continue to Dillsburg and take U.S. 15 South to Virginia. Just past Leesburg, VA, take 267 (Dulles Toll Road), watch for airport signs.



**Ronald Reagan National Airport** --- allow 2 1/2 - 3 hours

Take York Road (Route 74 S). Continue to Dillsburg and take U.S. 15 South to Fredrick. Take 270S to 495. Go right onto 495 to Northern Virginia to exit 13 (George Washington Parkway). Follow parkway to the airport.

**Shuttle Information**

There is a shuttle pick-up to the airports. Unique Limousine Service is in Harrisburg at 233-4431. The Philly shuttle pick up is in Mechanicsburg. All others pick up at Travel-lodge at the intersection of Hwy 81 and Hwy 11 on Harrisburg Pike. They don't have regular shuttles, you just call them with your departure time and they set up the shuttle. If you leave from BWI instead of Harrisburg, you can save hundreds of dollars in airfares. One-way charges: \$68.00 to BWI (+15 – 18% gratuity); \$69.00 to JFK; \$69.00 to Newark; (gratuity included)

## CHAPTER 2

# CALENDAR OF EVENTS

### ARMY WAR COLLEGE and POST EVENTS:

There always seems to be something happening at Carlisle Barracks. When you are not attending seminar events you will have plenty of post events to keep you busy. You may have heard that the students are at Carlisle on the "Athletic Scholarship." You may very well believe it with all the sports available to them.

The list below is to help you plan your stay by letting you know what is ahead. Please note that publicity and the information network is not always what it should be, so if there is an event listed and you haven't heard anything, ASK!

Attend as much or as little as you choose, but plan to have fun.

**STUDENT & SPOUSE BRIEFING** (July) – this all day event is held at Bliss Hall and is for Adults Only. Commanding General, Post Commander, and other key and essential people from around post will be on hand to welcome you and give you a heads up on the up coming year. *This posed a problem for some families with small children. Youth Services has a listing of certified babysitters in the area.*


**THE COUNTY FAIR / CENTRALIZED INPROCESSING** (July) – this is well worth attending. Post organizations, as well as local merchants, will be on hand to let you know what is available in the area. Bring the whole family, you will have an opportunity to sign up for classes, trips etc. You will also have an opportunity to speak with local and distant college representatives at the Education Fair.

**WELCOME PICNIC** (August) – Held behind the LeTort View Community Center (LVCC), fun for the whole family, competitions, \$10.00 per adult, kids eat free.

**OFFICERS' SPOUSES' CLUB SIGN UP** (August) – Held in LVCC, opportunity to sign up for OSC membership, classes, clubs, etc. The OSC plans a December trip to New York for shopping and to see the Rockettes, this is the time to sign up. Reservations go fast!

**OFF POST SOCIAL** (August) – Held at LVCC. Come and meet your neighbors! If you live off post this is a great way to meet people in your neighborhood, kids that attend your school, etc.

**GETTYSBURG STAFF RIDE** (August) – an educational day trip to Gettysburg for the whole family. Bring coolers, pack a picnic lunch and dress for walking/hiking. It is a fun day. (Spouses and children paid \$10 each to cover transportation. Not recommended for small children.)



**SOFTBALL** (August – October) – All students are required to participate, many faculty join in also. Spouses and families are encouraged to attend and cheer their team on. Many teams end each game with refreshments.

**AIR SHIPWRECK BALL** (September) - This event is hosted by the Air / Navy sector and is NOT a ball in the traditional sense but is a real hoot. A central theme is given to each seminar and they devise a skit to be judged at the sports stadium. Some of the spouses dressed and participated, some didn't. This is a very casual event, shorts or jeans are fine. The cost for the buffet ranges between \$35 - \$40 per person. LVCC provides a buffet with all the beer and soda you can drink. This is an outside dinner with dancing inside the club. The parade is for families but the buffet and dancing are for ADULTS ONLY.

**NEW YORK CITY TRIP** (October) - The War College takes the students to New York for visits to the UN and Embassies. Spouses were invited to attend. If you would like to go, start planning childcare arrangements immediately. There is more information on the NY Trip. (See pg. 10-11).

**VOLLEYBALL** – (October – December) – All seminars are requested to participate, spouses and families are encouraged to attend. All games are in the evening in the Jim Thorpe Fitness Center.

**MARINE CORPS BALL** (November) – a real ball and wonderful event, lots of fun, held out of town about 20 minutes away. \$45.00 a person.

**OSC CRAFT SHOW** (November) – Event to raise money for the community. Volunteers needed.

**MICROBREW FEST** (November) – Hosted by LVCC, over 30 different microbrews.

**ANNUAL JIM THORPE FIVE-MILE CLASSIC** – (November)

**ARMY / NAVY GAME** – (December) – a bus is provided to take you and your family to the game in Philadelphia, pickup / drop off on post, tickets can be purchased at ITR.

**SENIOR CITIZEN'S CHRISTMAS TEA** (December) - The whole post gets involved, students are given time off to participate. Individuals are escorted from surrounding nursing homes for an afternoon of entertainment at the club. There are various areas to help including: escorting, parking cars, nursing home helpers, entertainment and cookie baking. Plan to get involved; it is very rewarding.

**NEW YEAR'S EVE BASH** (December) – Held at the club. \$30.00 each, includes: heavy hors d'oeuvres, dancing, party hats / noisemakers and breakfast buffet.

**CHILI COOK OFF** (January) – This is a major event hosted by LVCC. Many seminars went wild with displays and costumes. Chili sampling, splat consistency, unusual ingredients, skit, and displays were some of the categories for prizes. (\$5.00 a person, included chili buffet)

**BASKETBALL** (January – March) –played in the evening at the Thorpe Fitness Center (new gym).

**SOCK HOP** (February) – This is hosted by the civilian students. Plan to bring your letter jacket and poodle skirt. Hula hoop, dance, costume and bubble blowing are a few of the contests. (\$20.00 a person, includes entrance and buffet.)


**OSC & AWC CLASS BENEFIT AUCTION** (March) – Event to raise money for the Outreach / Scholarship Fund. Individuals and Seminars are asked to donate items to be auctioned. This is a big event and very worthwhile to attend. Plan ahead, many seminars asked for donations from local merchants, others gave money within their seminar to purchase something to donate.

**JIM THORPE DAYS** (April) - Big sports days, all other War Colleges come to compete in various sporting events. Extends over two days with picnics at the end of each day. Picnic tickets were \$8.50 per person, each day. One held at the club and one at the golf course. The committee will have hats and T-shirts available to purchase.

**ARMY BALL** (May) – Traditional Army Birthday Ball held off post due to space. \$45.00 a person.

**WASHINGTON, DC TRIP** (May) – Students only.

**NSS WEEK** – (June) National Security Seminar Week - each seminar plays host to a small group of civilian visitors this week, usually during the last weeks of school. During NSS week, your seminar will sponsor a picnic or luncheon for their guests. Plan early to secure the best location!



**GRADUATION** (June) – usually held in the morning at the gazebo, brunch at the club is available, Sunday dress, families encouraged to attend, bring your camera.  
(For inclement weather event is held at Bliss Hall and seating is limited.)



## MISCELLANEOUS INFO

It seems as if you will Always be Writing Checks (AWC) when you get here. Below is a list of some of the expenses you may encounter during your year here. This is just a general idea; many items are not included such as NY trip expenses and extra activities. These are the prices used for AWC '01 and are subject to change.

**Class Dues** – (yearbook, cup & flower, copies, social events - \$125.00-US, \$60.00- IF) due in early October

**Air Shipwreck Ball** - \$80.00 a couple

**Class Picnic** - \$10.00 per person

**USMC Ball** - \$ 90.00 a couple

**Class Memento** - (typically a Civil War print) \$75.00

**Chili Cook Off** - \$10.00 a couple

**Army Ball** - \$90.00 a couple

**Softball Hat & shirt** - 20.00 shirt, Hat- \$8.00

This varies for each seminar (many seminars found local sponsors which defrayed costs, plan ahead.) Some spouses also had shirts & hats, think ahead and order in bulk.

**Family photo for yearbook** - \$20.00 and up if you choose to buy a package deal

**OSC Auction** – many seminars chose to donate \$10 (each person) to purchase a donation for the auctions (others planned ahead and hit the streets for donations.)

**SEMINAR LEADER SPOUSE DUTIES:** The War College class consists of 20 Seminars with typically 16 students (2-3 International) in each. Each seminar will have one student selected to act as the seminar leader. If your spouse is selected you will be asked to volunteer to assume some spouse leader duties or you may delegate the duties to another spouse volunteer within the seminar. The following are some duties submitted by a previous seminar leader spouse (SLS) that you will be asked to do. The primary responsibility of the SLS is to represent the seminar at the monthly information meeting. The meeting is chaired by the class president spouse is regularly attended by the spouses of the Commandant and Deputy Commandant. Community representatives will brief upcoming events. Meetings usually last one hour. It is then the responsibility of the SLS to pass the information to the other seminar spouses via newsletter, email, coffee / meeting each month or at the monthly seminar social. The copier at USAWC is available if your spouse will make the copies. This is not a difficult or time consuming job but is important as you are an important information link for the other spouses.

## NEW YORK CITY TRIP

There will be a formal briefing for people planning to go on this trip, usually held in Bliss Hall. Most organizations on post will be available to answer your questions and give you valuable information.


Each seminar has its own bus for transportation to and from NY. Both riders and luggage load at the PX and unload in the Post Office parking lot upon return. Coordinate with your seminar and plan to bring food and drinks for the trip. Individual coolers worked great on the bus.

**Think about babysitting early.** Many students arranged for a family member to stay with their children and the post is very helpful in providing services to them. The gates were manned and areas patrolled regularly. Security checks of quarters were available if requested. Babysitters are given temporary cards for PX / Commissary access and Youth Services planned extra activities for the kids. Emergency numbers are provided and a hot line is open 24 hours so you can be reached while in New York. **Childcare regulations states: a 13 yr. old may baby-sit up to 4 children, only 2 may be under the age of 2 years, 18 yr. old may stay overnight with other children. For more info see regulation 608-1 which is available through ACS or CDS. CDS provides a list of Red Cross Certified babysitters.**

Take plenty of money with you; everything is expensive. You are provided a room in a very nice hotel in a good location but no meals included. Baggage was handled in a very organized manner. Pick up and drop off was in order of seminar number.

Talk about the NY trip early on with your seminar and decide if you would like to do group activities as they will have to be planned before you leave. If you are planning on attending plays, shows, ballgames etc. get your tickets before you leave (check the internet and ITR). It is possible to get tickets at the discount ticket office in Times Square but many shows are sold out. You can see the Yankees play for free at Yankee Stadium by showing your military ID. This will get you seats up high but with a good view.

Do not worry about dressing up unless you have special plans. People wore everything from jeans to Sunday dresses to the theatre. Wear good walking shoes, dress for comfort and warmth.

**The Today Show** – get there NLT 5:30AM or you will not get a good place to stand. You will be more readily noticed if you have a sign, flag etc. to catch their eye.

**Rosie O'Donnell** - did not respond to any of our groups.

**Fifth Avenue** is a must. It's great just to walk the whole thing.

**Macy's** is an experience in itself because it has so many floors (that's about it.)

**Manhattan Mall** – 9 levels of shopping and largest food court in NY (6<sup>th</sup> Ave. & 33rd St.)

**Statue of Liberty & Ellis Island** – there is a bus provided upon arrival to NY to see these sights, don't pass on either. Return by subway or walk if you are up to it.





## DRIVING DIRECTIONS TO NEW YORK CITY

Take 1-81 N to Harrisburg; take 1-78 N toward Allentown. Stay on 1-78 until you see signs for I-19 and/or Holland Tunnel/New York City. (Always follow the Holland Tunnel signs.) There are two options: Express or Local; either is fine.

The Holland Tunnel is located in Hoboken. You will come to a major traffic light with the Holland Tunnel ahead of you. At this light you must turn left; follow the road underneath an overpass and stay to the right. Look for Central Parking which will be located on your left side. (Central Parking will charge you \$16.00 a day (that was the rate in December) to park your car. You pay as you give them the car.) From Central Parking walk across the street to the Path Station. The subway (Path) will take you to Manhattan. The cost is \$1.00 per person and took about 14 minutes to get to 32nd Street. We got off at the Manhattan Mall Terminal not far from the Empire State Building.

## WALKING TOUR OF NEW YORK CITY

We'll start and finish our walking tour near Rockefeller Plaza. This area is very crowded during the holiday season. Don't panic if you get separated from other groups-just follow the directions in this packet.

1. To start your tour, stand at the spot where you'll be looking across the ice skating rink at the large gilded bronze statue of Prometheus. In mythology, Prometheus was one of the Titans and the brother of Hercules. The Titans were a family of Giants with great power and strength. (The *Titanic* gets its name indirectly from them.) This part of Rockefeller Plaza serves as an ice skating rink in the winter and as an outdoor café in the summer. The building in the background is the GE building home of NBC television and radio studios. The flags surrounding the perimeter represent the member nations of the United Nations.
2. Now turn around 180 degrees and head toward Fifth Avenue (away from the skating rink). You will pass through the Channel Gardens so named because they separate a building owned by France from a building owned by England (the UK) just like the English Channel separates those two countries. A spectacular display of Christmas lights is installed here for the holiday season.
3. After you go through the Channel Gardens, turn left onto Fifth Avenue. Stop in front of the International Building to see the Atlas Statue. Atlas, another of the Titans, was condemned to forever hold the world on his shoulders. That's what is being depicted in this statue.
4. Now cross Fifth Avenue at the crosswalk and walk toward St. Patrick's Cathedral. The cathedral's construction began in 1858 and was completed in 1906. Its Gothic architecture is patterned after the cathedral in Cologne, Germany.
5. Enter the cathedral. Unless there is a special ceremony in progress, go down the right aisle toward the front of the church. Then, near the front, turn left and go out the side door onto 51<sup>st</sup> Street. Cross 51<sup>st</sup> Street on Fifth Avenue and head uptown.
6. As you walk up Fifth Avenue, the street numbers will be getting bigger – 52<sup>nd</sup>, 53<sup>rd</sup>, etc. You will be passing some of the most famous and glamorous stores in America. You will pass Saks Fifth Avenue, Cartier, Gucci, Bijan (shopping by appointment only), Godiva's, Elizabeth Arden's (notice the famous red door) and several others. *Refer to your diagram of 5<sup>th</sup> Ave. for store locations.*
7. After you cross 56<sup>th</sup> Street, stop at Trump Tower. Go inside through the shiny brass doors to the pink marble lobby. Walk straight ahead to the atrium. Look up at the waterfall, or take the escalator to the next floor and look at the shops. On the upper floors are the New York apartments (Michael Jackson, Steven Spielberg and the Donald himself.) Exit the building by reversing your route.

8. When you exit Trump Tower, you will be back on Fifth Avenue. Turn right and continue in the direction you were heading before entering Trump Tower. The Disney Store will be coming up, Warner Brothers Store will be on the next block (see enclosed map). These stores carry all kinds of merchandise that is tied in with their movies. The theme in both stores is “Buying is Fun.” It’s hard to resist all the fun stuff on display. You may also want to save your money for Tiffany’s, which is also on this block.
9. Around the corner on 57<sup>th</sup> Street is Nike Town – three floors of Nike products in a state of the art monument to commercialism.
10. The Warner Brothers Store is across 57<sup>th</sup> Street. No matter which store you chose, exit and continue walking up Fifth Avenue. Don’t miss the elevator controlled by Superman or Batman.
11. When you cross 58<sup>th</sup> Street, you will see FAO Schwarz, New York’s famous toy store. During the holiday season there will probably be a long line to get in through the front door. You can also just look through the windows to see their famous clock and the elevator that looks like a giant robot. You might remember this store as the place where Tom Hanks danced on the giant piano keyboard in *BIG*.
12. Walk back along the side of the store (58<sup>th</sup> Street) and enter the store at the entrance on 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue. (Most people don’t know about this and there shouldn’t be a line.) Check out the attached “Barbie” store.
13. Leave FAO Schwarz by way of the Fifth Avenue exit, find a crosswalk and cross Fifth Avenue heading toward the Plaza Hotel. The turnaround in front of the hotel will probably be filled with limos. Lots of interesting looking people will be entering and exiting the hotel. Every 5<sup>th</sup> Grader knows that this is the hotel where Kevin stayed in the movie *Home Alone II: Lost in New York*.
14. Enter the Plaza Hotel and just act as if you belong there. Go through the lobby and turn right at the Palm Court (restaurant surrounded by large palms.) Go to the corner, turn left and then make a right into another lobby. Head for the exit and exit onto 59<sup>th</sup> Street, which is also known as Central Park South.
15. You will exit the Plaza Hotel onto 59<sup>th</sup> Street, also known as Central Park South. Turn left as you exit heading away from the large gold equestrian statue. Across the street is Central Park. You may see some of the famous horse drawn carriages that have taken many a character from television, motion pictures and novels for rides through the park. We’ll see more of the park later.
16. Proceeding west on 59<sup>th</sup> Street you’ll pass Mickey Mantle’s restaurant and Rumpelmayer’s. Rumpelmayer’s is a major New York hangout for kids who love ice cream and stuffed animals. It’s been around for a long time. You might remember in the stage show and movie *Annie* that Daddy Warbucks takes Annie to Rumpelmayer’s as a treat.
17. Turn left (south) onto the Avenue of the Americas (6<sup>th</sup> Avenue). Across the street you’ll see one of New York’s many theme restaurants, Jekyll and Hyde’s. It all started with the Hard Rock Café (you’ll see that later) with its rock n’ roll theme. Then Planet Hollywood, Motown Café and the Harley Davidson Café. The most recent theme restaurant is the Television City back at Rockefeller Center. Jekyll and Hyde’s is kind of a Disney World’s haunted mansion with food.
18. Turn right (west) onto West 57<sup>th</sup> Street. Get on the south side of the street. You’ll pass Planet Hollywood, one of the restaurants in the chain owned by Arnold, Bruce, Sylvester and Demi. If you have the time and inclination you might stop and match handprints with the stars. They’re on the wall in front. There is also a souvenir shop in the restaurant.
19. On the corner of West 57<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue is one of the most famous concert halls in the world, Carnegie Hall. How do you get to Carnegie Hall? Practice, practice, practice...
20. Mr. Weidner used to apartment sit for his brother-in-law who lived in the big building that’s located diagonally from Carnegie Hall. Some may remember this building (the Osborne) as the one in which actor Gig Young killed himself and his young wife. Dick Clark owns an apartment in this building as do other celebrities.
21. Turn left (south) onto 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue. Head south on 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue. The street numbers should be getting smaller. When you reach 53<sup>rd</sup> Street, turn left (east) and head toward the Avenue of the Americas. Turn right (south) on 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue toward 50<sup>th</sup> Street. You’ll pass Radio City Music Hall on the corner of 6<sup>th</sup> and 50<sup>th</sup>. They have a wonderful Christmas display.







VEHICLE REGISTRATION - 245-4115 (Bldg. 400)

*POST:* Installation vehicle registration is mandatory for vehicles used on post by persons assigned to, living on, or employed at Carlisle Barracks within 3 days of arrival. Registration requires a driver's license, proof of liability insurance, state registration, and USAREUR or state safety inspection within the previous 12 months. Registration is at the MP Desk (behind the Fire Station in Bldg. 400), 24 hours, seven days a week. Temporary registration is required while waiting for documents or inspection.

*STATE:* Pennsylvania law requires U.S. military personnel and family members to register vehicles in their home state or Pennsylvania. Vehicles are registered locally through state-licensed notaries at automobile clubs, car dealerships and various other locations. A list of these locations is available at the MP desk.

Because Pennsylvania state registration can be complicated and expensive, all personnel are encouraged to renew home state registration prior to arrival at Carlisle Barracks. Registration of vehicles may also incur a state sales tax liability if no tax has been previously paid. Overseas Command registrations (USAREUR / AFI, etc.) are valid in Pennsylvania for only 45 days after arrival of the owner (not the vehicle) in CONUS.

VETERINARY SERVICES - 245-4168 (Bldg. 627)

M - F 0830 - 1500

All pets must be registered with the Post Veterinary Service within ten working days of arrival or procurement of the animal. Post registration is also accomplished during the consolidated in-processing day for each Army War College class. Proof of rabies vaccination and medical treatment records from last military installation must be provided at this time. The registration tag will be attached to the animal's collar, harness, or cage and must be worn by the animal at all times when outdoors. A listing of current registration numbers are maintained by the Post Veterinary Services and Military Police.

WEAPONS REGISTRATION – 245-4115 (Bldg. 400) Mandatory for individuals who reside on Carlisle Barracks. Military ID and serial number of weapon is required for registration.

Pennsylvania Law requires military and family member drivers to be licensed in their home state of legal residence or in Pennsylvania.

Overseas Command (USAREUR) driver's licenses of service members are valid for only 45 days after arrival in Pennsylvania. Family member USAREUR licenses are NOT valid at all in Pennsylvania.

Driver licensing in Pennsylvania can be complicated. Unless a current state license can be presented, applicants must take the first-time driver exam, to include the medical examination and hands-on driving test. Recommend you obtain or renew home state licenses prior to arrival in PA. ## HOUSING

### Community Housing Referral and Relocations Services Office (CHRRSO)

Off post housing availability - The Carlisle Barracks CHRRSO obtains and maintains listings of adequate rental and sales units reflecting the full range of prices, sizes, and locations of housing assets in our local community. Properties listed with this office will be inspected when there is a question of adequacy. Therefore, we suggest that you personally, or through an agent, inspect the property prior to making any commitments to rent or purchase. Many of the rental properties listed with the CHRRSO are passed on from year to year to fellow students and permanent party personnel. Many listings never make it back to the currently published list maintained by this office. The CHRRSO is available to assist you in all your relocation needs. RENTALS GO FAST SO START EARLY!

Army War College Students and their families are primarily housed in: College Arms, Young Hall, and Faith Apartments. Few are located in Marshall Ridge, Forbes Avenue and the Farmhouse.

### UNACCOMPANIED PERSONNEL HOUSING (UPH)

**BACHELOR QUARTERS:** Carlisle Barracks has 16 units available in Truscott Hall (Bldg 40) for bachelor officers and senior non-commissioned officers (SNCO). Each unit is fully furnished, and provides individually controlled heating and air conditioning. Each unit has a private bath, bedroom, living/dining room and a small kitchen with full sized appliances. Residents must provide their own linens, bath and kitchen supplies. Cable TV and telephone service is available at the resident's own expense. Laundry facilities are located within the building. Truscott Hall units are assigned to permanent party officers, USAWC Student and SNCO. Priorities are key and essential personnel, bonafide bachelors and International Fellows. Geographical bachelors must seek housing in the local community.

**BACHELOR ENLISTED QUARTERS:** Fifty-five spaces are available in Blackwood Hall (Bldg 420) for junior bachelor enlisted personnel. Each room is furnished to include a refrigerator. Central air conditioning is provided. Residents must provide their own linens, bath and kitchen supplies. Cable TV and telephone service for individual rooms is available at the resident's own expense. A dayroom, TV room, community kitchen and laundry facilities are located within the building. Additional storage areas are also available in the attic area of Bldg 420. Blackwood Hall units are assigned to permanent party enlisted. Priorities are key and essential personnel and bonafide bachelors. Geographical bachelors must seek housing in the local community. *Note: Construction of a new Enlisted Barracks is underway with plans for completion in 2002. The new Barracks will be a 48 person 1 plus 1 design.*

There are no mess facilities available at Carlisle Barracks. However, the installation provides several food service organizations plus a wide range of restaurants and fast-food locations just outside the installation gates.

## FAMILY QUARTERS

Carlisle Barracks has government housing for a total of 316 families. Quarters range in style from multi-unit apartment complexes to single-unit homes.

Quarters are assigned to permanent party personnel when the military sponsor is physically present and has signed in for duty at Carlisle Barracks. War College students receive designated quarters prior to their arrival based on the Student Billeting Plan for their class.

### QUARTERS DESCRIPTIONS:

**GARRISON LANE / ROYAL AMERICAN CIRCLE:** Units were built in 1940. Two single and 18 semi-detached units, each with four bedrooms, three baths, kitchen with small eating area; formal dining room; living room with working fireplace and year round sunroom. Each unit has a full basement and attic space for storage and a detached single car garage. Units contain 2230 net square feet of living space. Street parking and off street parking is provided. Assigned to permanent party senior officers.

**MARSHALL RIDGE:** Four single and 32 semi-detached units each with four bedrooms and two baths. Units were constructed in 1964 and are 1622sf. Marshall Ridge units have no basements; so outdoor storage sheds are provided. Off street parking provided. Assigned to permanent party officers and Senior NCOs.

**LOVELL-PRATT AVENUE:** On Pratt Avenue-a single unit with three bedrooms and two and one-half baths. Unit was built in 1909 with 1946 sf; two semi-detached units built in 1905, 1349sf each with three bedrooms and one and one-half baths. All Pratt units have full basements and attic areas for storage. Pratt Avenue units are assigned to Senior NCOs with street parking only. On Lovell Avenue- four semi-detached units: two units are 1905sf and two are 2139sf and were built in 1904 and 1905. All Lovell units are three bedrooms and two and one-half baths. Lovell units also have full basement and attic areas for storage. Lovell Avenue units are assigned to permanent party senior officers with both street and off-street parking.

**COREN APARTMENTS:** Five apartments: one apartment has three bedrooms and two and one-half baths; three apartments have four bedrooms and three baths; and one apartment has six bedrooms and three baths. Units were constructed in 1863 and range from 2105sf to 3070sf. Basement storage is available for all units. Off street parking provided. Units are assigned to permanent party senior officers.

**WILSON HOUSE:** A refurbished farmhouse originally constructed in 1781 with three bedrooms, two full and two half baths; 2071sf. This unit has spacious grounds with a garage and off street parking provided. Assigned to a permanent party officers.

**RANCH HOUSE:** This one-story house was built in 1957, 1604sf with three bedrooms, two baths, and attached garage. Modifications have been made to this one level living quarters to accommodate physically handicapped sponsors and/or dependent family members. Off street parking provided. The Ranch House is assigned to a permanent party officer.

**FARM HOUSE:** This semi-detached; two story farmhouse was built in 1859; each unit has three bedrooms and one and one-half baths. Off street parking provided. One unit is assigned to permanent party senior grade officers; 2050sf and the other unit is assigned to USAWC Student, 1318sf.

**FAITH APARTMENTS:** Ten brick semi-detached units were built in 1947 each with four bedrooms, two baths and a year round sun porch. Each unit has one bedroom and full bath, located on the first level with the living area. The remaining three bedrooms and full bath are located on the second level with the laundry room located off of the master bedroom. Unit size is 1622sf with an additional storage space in the basement area. Basement storage area is accessible from an exterior entrance only. Street parking is provided. Units are assigned to USAWC Students.

**FORBES AVENUE:** Twenty eight semi-detached brick units, built in 1939; each have 1275sf of living space with three bedrooms and one and three-quarter baths. Third bedroom is quite small and is often utilized as a walk-in closet. Many units have occupant-constructed improvements within the basement area. Forbes units also have a working fireplace in the living room and a year round sun porch. Twelve units have detached garages and 16 have garages within the basement area of the quarters. Street parking and off street parking is provided. Units are assigned to permanent party officers.

**COLLEGE ARMS: (Smurf Village)** One hundred single-frame houses of multi-level design: 50 units with three bedrooms, a bath and one-half and a finished basement with laundry room. The three bedroom units are 1265 sf; the kitchens are small alley style without dishwashers; (except for just a few units that have kitchen upgrades and revised floor plans.) Another 50 units within College Arms have four bedrooms, two baths and a finished basement with laundry room. The four bedroom units are 1570 sf and have larger kitchen space. All houses have crawl space storage in the lower level plus an outdoor storage shed. Off street parking is available for two vehicles. College Arms neighborhood stretches from the Commissary/PX area to Collins Hall. Most of the houses back up to a common area with playgrounds and plenty of green space. Units are assigned to USAWC Students *NOTE: A phased plan for new construction of AFH is planned to begin in FY03. Additional information will be provided as the plans develop.*

**YOUNG HALL:** Forty-four apartments located adjacent to the Grandstand/Sports Field, 15 with three bedrooms, ranging in size from 832 to 1744 square feet, five of the 15 with two bathrooms, and 10 with one bathroom. Twenty-nine apartments have two bedrooms and one bath, 14 different sizes ranging from 784 to 1232 square feet. Twenty-two apartments (two Bays) are assigned to USAWC Students and 22 apartments (two bays) are assigned to enlisted personnel. Young Hall units present the biggest challenges for residents. Some of the two bedroom units are significantly larger than the three bedroom units due to floor plan configurations and some extremely large closets. Units are carpeted with neutral shade Berber carpeting. Parking is provided in two locations adjacent to Young Hall. A service drive is provided for resident's convenience for loading and unloading. All units have exterior porches/balconies. With the diversity in floor plans and quarters size, it is suggested new residents contact the Housing office for specific information for the unit they are being

assigned. Laundry facilities (connections for washer/dryers) and individual storage areas are located within the basement of each bay of Young Hall.

*NOTE: A total renovation project for Young Hall is planned for FY03. Additional information will be provided as the plans develop.*

**DOLLHOUSE:** A single one-story house built in 1915 with three bedrooms and one bath; 1255sf. Although not a large unit, the Doll House has the charm of a cozy cottage. Unit was built in 1915 and has no basement. Exterior storage shed is provided. Street parking and off street parking is provided. Assigned to permanent party officer.

**STANWIX APARTMENTS:** This 45 unit apartment complex was constructed in 1950 in an off-post area located less than a half-mile from Carlisle Barracks. Seven apartments; 1250-1500sf; have four bedrooms with two baths, 16 apartments; 949sf; have three bedrooms with one bath, and 22 apartments; 762sf; have two bedrooms with one bath. Closet space, particularly kitchen storage is limited in the three and two bedroom units. Laundry connections for washers/dryers are located in the kitchen areas. Individual storage areas are located within each building for each unit. Street parking and off street parking is provided. Stanwix units are assigned to enlisted personnel.

**ARMSTRONG APARTMENTS:** Ten single houses, each; 839sf, with two bedrooms and one bath. Units have no basements, so storage space is limited to a small utility room in the quarters and an outside storage shed. Street parking and off street parking is provided. Families love the yard space that comes with these units. Assigned to enlisted personnel.

**FLOWER ROAD:** Three single houses located by Army Lodging facilities and range in size from 1400-1500sf; each unit has three bedrooms and two baths. Basement storage area is accessible from an exterior entrance only. Street parking and off street parking is provided. Units are assigned to Senior NCO's.

#### **GARAGES AND PARKING SPACES:**

Garrison Lane, Royal American Circle, Forbes Avenue, Wilson House, and Ranch House have garages. Most other quarters have one or more parking spaces off the main thoroughfare.

**GENERAL COMMENTS:** Except for command quarters' entertainment areas, government furniture is not provided to residents of government quarters. Each set of quarters has its own government-owned range and refrigerator, which will not be removed, from the dwelling. Gas ranges are installed in College Arms, Marshall Ridge, and Armstrong Apartments, while all other quarters have electric ranges.

All quarters have utility connections for washers, electric dryers and freezers. No connections are available for gas dryers. Special adapters for dishwashers, washing machines and dryers are not provided. Quarters on Garrison Lane, Royal American Circle, Forbes Avenue, Young Hall Apartments, and College Arms, outlets for washers and dryers are in the basements. Most other quarters have utility rooms.

Air conditioning is provided in all quarters. Personally owned air conditioners are not authorized.

Television service is provided by a commercial firm, which furnishes a multichannel cable service on a subscription basis. Most housing units are equipped with two cable outlets located in the living area and master bedroom. Installations of personal television/AM/FM antennas or satellite dishes are not authorized without the written consent of the Housing Office.

## STUDENT RESIDENT'S COMMENTS AND HELPFUL HINTS

COLLEGE ARMS: "Smurf village is a well-deserved name, the smallest kitchen you will ever have (except for a few that have been renovated, they also include dishwashers). Definitely need to leave a good amount in storage. There are lots of kids in the neighborhood, so your kids will have plenty of playmates. It is nice to have a single family home. Adequate laundry room (bring your own washer/dryer), room in the laundry room for an extra refrigerator."

YOUNG HALL: "Communal living, stairwell style, fun! Apartments vary considerably in both size and layout. Store as much as you can do without, or you can store what doesn't fit AFTER you move in (if you don't get a storage shipment beforehand.)" "Apartments in center tend to be dark, one "Bay" has balconies in back; all others are in front facing the sports field. Some have very small kitchens; some have portable dishwasher faucets. Air conditioning is by window units so bring fans."

"Electrical outlets are not abundant, plan to use extension cords and multi-plugs. Extra shelves are handy as are cabinets to hold linens, etc.. Overhead lighting. Storage rooms for each apartment in the basement, the smaller apartments have larger storage rooms."

"Steam heat, good hot water, outdoor stairs to second floor apartments. For those with small children, housing suggests bottom floor for safety reasons. This works out well for riding toys, etc. Each apartment has one designated parking spot behind the building; overflow is across the street in Garrison Command parking lot. There is a "usage" lane to drive up and unload groceries or other items and then park elsewhere."

FORBES AVENUE: Built in 1939/1940 these houses are quite quaint and very nice looking from the outside. Each has wood floors, fireplace, sunroom, garage and basement. They are approximately 1300 square feet, excluding the basement. Room size is fairly small (to include closets); third bedroom is tiny. Basement accommodates washer/dryer, freezer, refrigerator and extra storage space. Extra room in basement can be used for TV room. The kitchen has a garbage disposal, dishwasher and although it might seem small has lots of cabinets.

MARSHALL RIDGE: "Don't bring everything, but you will be pleased with how much will fit into these quarters. I put too much in storage - I should have brought more. A nice, quiet street with adequate housing for an 11 month stay. Air-conditioned, windows have shades but most units do not have carpeting. Have dishwashers but no disposal."


GARRISON LANE / ROYAL AMERICAN CIRCLE: "Garrison Lane is a terrific place to live. We have quarters that have more than 2500 square feet. The many windows allow for a perfect light in all seasons. These quarters were built in the 1940's so if someone tells you their historical, no. I have a front yard that looks like a golf course and it was. Many of us still sink shots into the 4 acres in front of the house. We have a huge basement that is sub-divided into 3 parts. It makes the perfect rec room for the kids. The walls that subdivide the duplexes must have been well insulated. We hardly ever hear anything on our neighbor's side. The sunroom that was added on is where many people make their TV rooms. It's a cold room in the winter and we can't ever seem to get the heat just right. Oh yes, last, there's the attic. It's very large and well lit. In fact, it's just too big. We are ever acquiring more junk. The kitchens were designed for small families. They have, however, incorporated as much cabinet space as possible. Probably the worst part about this house is that you have to enter from the kitchen. Everyone thinks this is the front door because it's on the side of the street. Of course it's always the messiest side for us."

OVERALL COMMENTS: "Bring your Christmas decorations - this post likes to do Christmas." "A very beautiful post and a safe environment to give my children a bit more freedom." "Don't need two cars if you live on post. AWC students walk to class."

# CHAPTER 4

## Medical & Dental



### MEDICAL CARE – TRICARE

1. Your Primary Care Manager is Dunham U.S. Army Health Clinic. If you need specialty care, your PCM will refer you.
  2. If you are traveling out of the area and require medical care (not an emergency), call 1-888-333-4522 for authorization.
  3. If you have a bona fide emergency, go to the nearest Emergency Room for treatment.
- A TRICARE Service Center is located in the Clinic. The staff will be able to answer all of your questions regarding TRICARE Prime, Standard, and TRICARE for Life Programs.
  - TRICARE coverage in the Northeast Region is NOT automatic. If you have been enrolled in TRICARE in another region, you must complete a change form to enroll in Region One. If you are PCSing within the same Region and changing your PCM, you still must file a change form.
  - College students (not residing with the parents in Region One) should be enrolled in the Region where they reside.
  - New prescriptions may be filled at Dunham Health Clinic. Refills at the Clinic will take 2 days to obtain. The refill order number is 1-800-248-6337 – choose #4 and then #1 for Dunham. If the medication is unavailable from the pharmacy on Carlisle Barracks, you may pay a \$3.00 fee or \$9.00 co-payment and get the prescription at designated pharmacies. You must show your TRICARE card.

  - If you need to have monthly refills on medication and will be out of Region One when the refill is due, your TRICARE card is not valid and you will be responsible for the payment of the medication. If you know that you will be away and will need a refill, have your PCM order the needed medication well before travel.

**HERSHEY MEDICAL CENTER – 45 minutes**

Take I-81 North to exit 59 onto 581 (about 8 minutes). 581 East will join with I-83 North. Continue to Harrisburg in the center lane. Cross the river and take 322 East to Hershey Park Drive. Medical center is on your right.

**WALTER REED MEDICAL CENTER – 2 ½ hours**

Take Route 74 South to Dillsburg and take U.S. 15 South to Frederick, MD. At Frederick, take 270 South towards Washington D.C. – 270 South runs into 495 (Capital Beltway). Take 495 East toward Silver Spring / College Park (northern loop). After about 3.8 miles, take exit 31B / Georgia Avenue South. Immediately get in the center lane and continue down Georgia Avenue for 4 to 5 miles. Walter Reed is on your right; park in the parking garage on your left, just past the guard shack.

**BETHESDA HOSPITAL – 2 hours**

Take Route 74 to Dillsburg. At Dillsburg, take Route 15 South to 270. Take 270 toward Washington D.C. Follow 270 South and exit onto 355 South. Stay in the left lane.

**DUNHAM ARMY HEALTH CLINIC INFO**

Dunham Army Health Clinic (Bldg. 450) is an ambulatory treatment facility providing primary medical services to authorized beneficiaries. The clinic is staffed and equipped to provide care for routine outpatient medical conditions. Family practice is the primary clinical service available, supported by limited pediatrics and gynecology. Additionally, the clinic provides immunizations, optometry, physical therapy, physical exams, mammography and social work services. Dunham does not provide obstetric services.


The clinic does not have an emergency room or inpatient capabilities; however, adequate emergency services are available in the local community. Hospitalization and specialized medical care are available on a referral basis through military medical treatment facilities at Ft Meade, Walter Reed, Bethesda Naval Hospital, or to local civilian sources.

Civilian medical care for other than active duty members is normally cost shared by the sponsor. TRICARE Prime enrollment makes healthcare more accessible and easier to use at reasonable rates. Prime enrollment is highly encouraged for all family members. Any additional information can be obtained from the Health Benefits Advisor at Dunham Clinic.

**DENTAL CARE – UNITED CONCORDIA** (<http://www.ucci.com>)

Family members should be enrolled in DEERS if overseas prior to arriving in CONUS, to receive dental care with United Concordia. (The enrollment period may take 30-60 days before coverage is allowed.) The DEERS number is 1-800-538-9552 – Monday through Friday, 0600-1700 PST.

Call for benefits and coverage with United Concordia 1-800-866-8499. Basic coverage includes exam and cleaning every 6 months, and two bitewing x-rays once a year. A full set of mouth x-rays is authorized every 3 years. 80% paid – fillings; 50% paid – crowns, bridges, partials and dentures, orthodontics (ortho up to \$1,200 for children 18 and younger).



There is no dental care for family members at the Dental Clinic on Carlisle Barracks. Check for participating dentists who accept United Concordia Insurance in your local area or call 1-800-866-8499.

## CHAPTER 5

### SCHOOLS

Registration for ALL students attending any Carlisle Area District school should be completed upon or before arrival at Carlisle Barracks. As soon as you know you are coming to the AWC begin coordinating with your present counselor and Carlisle High School counselors. DO NOT wait until the county fair in August. Students, regardless of grade entering, can register M-Th at the Administrative Building, 801 S. Hanover St. between 0830-1530. Hand-carry shot records, school transfer records, birth certificates, and any special paperwork, such as IEP's, standardized test results, letters for college recommendations from teachers & coaches, and course descriptions from your previous school, as these will be needed for the registration process. PLEASE NOTE: The Carlisle School district assigns our (on post) elementary and Middle School children to certain schools in late August. If you have a preference you can make a specific request when you register your child. Every effort is made to grant your request, but no guarantees. The decision will be made on quarters assignment, bus schedules, class sizes and number of children per family. Representatives from the War college are present to insure fairness of the school assignment session. After receiving your MS school assignment go to the school and set up the club electives. *The most specific information is provided for the Carlisle schools since the majority of our children attend here. However, the other three school districts require similar records for registration and sports.*

One day is set aside to register all International students regardless of grade. Birth certificate, passport and immunization records are needed to register. Registration is held in the cafeteria at the Swartz Building. Bring as much information of previous classes and examinations as possible. Students are given the registration date when they in process at Carlisle Barracks or you can call the district office at 240-6834.

Physicals are required for EVERY sport played at the Middle or High school level. These physicals MUST be obtained within 45 days of the start of the sport, and by a PA physician...so don't bother getting that sports physical BEFORE you leave your current duty station; you'll just have to do it again here. Physicals are FREE and done cattle-call style on two consecutive Thursdays at the High School West Gym. Don't forget to take a physical form at school registration; they are not always available during the physicals.

We are pleased to report that the public and private school systems in the Carlisle area provide for a quality educational experience. The majority of our children attend the Carlisle Area School District, which in 1996 was ranked by Money Magazine as one of the top 100 public school systems in the country. There are 7 elementary schools, 2 middle schools and 1 high school.

There are also five private elementary schools in Carlisle and a private high school in Camp Hill. Proof of community service hours and driver's education classes are necessary.

**BUS TRANSPORTATION**

School bus service is provided by the Carlisle School District. Buses are routed through town and Carlisle Barracks to stop at established loading and unloading points on a fixed schedule. This schedule is published in the local paper (The Sentinel) close to the beginning of school. Carlisle School District buses transport children residing on Carlisle Barracks that attend St. Patrick's School. A private bus transports students attending Trinity High School. Questions relating to the operation of the Trinity bus should be referred to St. Patrick's Rectory at 717-243-4111.

**ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS**

There are 7 elementary schools in the Carlisle District. Students are assigned to a selected school after registrations are complete. New student orientations are held one or two weeks before the start of school. Information is sent home in the mail in August or you can call the registration office at 717-240-6894.

Foreign languages, orchestra and band instructions are offered throughout the school year depending on grade level.

The gifted education program in the district is called Academically Challenging Topics, or ACT, and is accomplished through separate in-school classes attended by the ACT students during their normal school day (in both elementary and middle school). Following the second grade, students are identified and admitted into the ACT program according to state guidelines. If you are new to the district you can request a testing date when you register your child with acceptance into the program taking about a month.

## MIDDLE SCHOOLS

Lamberton and Wilson are the two schools which make up the Carlisle Middle School program. If your child plays an interscholastic sport, they are organized with students from the two buildings forming one team. The same is true for special music performances.



The middle schools are unique in that they have a 6-day cycle. For half of each day a group of students and their teachers meet in the classrooms of the “pod” area for English/language arts, social studies, mathematics, science and reading instruction. The majority of the remaining time is devoted to instruction in physical education, music, art, creative living, technology education and health. All students are assigned an advisor and advisory groups meet regularly. There is also time within the 6-day cycle devoted to instrumental or vocal music rehearsals, and special interest clubs.

A limited number of 8th grade students are offered Algebra I. The student must have a B+ in seventh grade math and score a 90 or better on the Orleans-Hanna Algebra Prognosis Test (offered at Wilson MS in early August.) It previously was required that a score of 90 or better be achieved to be placed in Algebra I; however, if your child scores above a 70, has the B+ from 7<sup>th</sup> grade math and YOUR approval they can be placed in Algebra I for eighth grade. If your student has already taken Algebra I in 7<sup>th</sup> grade request at registration to have your child attend Wilson Middle School (next to the HS) so they may go to the high school for higher level math courses in eighth grade.

Foreign language is offered beginning in seventh grade. A student is able to complete a half-year of French, German or Spanish in the seventh grade and the second half in eighth grade. Enrollment is limited to students entering the 7th grade unless your 8th grader has already started the program in another school. Students enrolled in the reading support program are not eligible for a foreign language.

Orientations for new students and their parents will be held at Lamberton and Wilson Middle Schools in late August.

**NOTE:** Your child's new best friend next door and the their buddy down the street could possibly all go to different schools. They do try to keep families together but the schools are filled on a needs basis. The children don't seem to have a problem with this once school gets started.

## HIGH SCHOOL

There are two buildings that serve the 9th, 10th 11th and 12th graders of the Carlisle Thundering Herd (school colors - green and white; mascot is the Bison). The Swartz building houses the 9th and 10th grade homerooms and the West building houses the 11th and 12th grade homerooms on one campus. Many students travel between the buildings during the day for common classes, programs and services. Enrollment is approximately 1600 students with 120 professional staff and 50 support staff members on campus. The telephone number for the Counseling Center is 717-240-6863 at West and 717-240-6842 at Swartz.

**FOR SENIORS:** Each year Carlisle enrolls 40 or more new seniors. Many will be applying to colleges early in the year. Most college applications require teacher and counselor recommendations. If there is a special counselor, teacher or administrator in your current school that knows your child and his/her talents, skills and aspirations, request a "college recommendation" from them before you leave.

**FOR JUNIORS:** Many physicals are required this year with the most important being the 11th grade physical as required by law. Other physicals are required for a work permit, driver's permit, and sports (fall, winter and spring). We encourage you to incorporate many of these requirements into one physical by providing the physician with the necessary forms to be signed all at once. The 11th grade physical can often be used for both work permits and driver's permits but sports physicals are provided at designated times by the Carlisle School District and are valid for only ONE season. The sports physical CANNOT be used to fulfill the 11<sup>th</sup> grade physical requirement.

**SPECIAL PROGRAMS:** Honors courses are available in English, science and foreign language. Advanced placement courses are offered in mathematics and social studies. An early admission program to Dickinson College is also available to qualifying students. Trade and industrial courses including work experience programs are also included in the school's program of studies.

If your child is presently in a gifted program please contact Dave Apgar or Rita Warren 240-6820 before 1 April to enroll your child in the district's Academically Challenging Topics (ACT) program. (The district requires 45 school days to process an application for this program and must comply with state rules requiring a series of tests and evaluations before an application will be considered. If you wait until your arrival to have your child rested you could delay admission into the program until November.) If your child has completed honors courses bring the course description with you for registration. All honors courses are NOT automatically accepted for GPA.

**SPORTS, CLUB and ACTIVITIES:** Carlisle High School offers 16 sports for boys and/or girls over the fall, winter and spring seasons. It is recommended that for fall sports you call the high school to find out about early try-outs and sport camps. Some camps/clinics are held at Messiah College and Shippensburg University. For questions relating to physicals and fall athletics, please call Mr. Dave Eavenson, Athletic Director, at 717-240-6878 / 6882.

There are 60 clubs and activities ranging from National Honor Society to music, art and reading to environmental and volunteering to sports and cooking to S.A.D.D. Thundering Herdpage: Carlisle High School has it's own web site at <http://www.carliseschools.org/>. You will find up to date material published by the students and teachers with the approval of the school.

**NOTE:** The physical education uniform for the high school and middle schools must be purchased before the school year and consists of Kelly green shorts (sweatpants for winter) and a plain white T-shirt. The school may recommend getting the T-shirt with "Carlisle" written on the front. This is not necessary and tends to make the military children stand out as "newbies." Green shorts are hard to find in Carlisle so buy before you come if possible.

**NOTE:** When snow and ice arrive here in Carlisle, the easiest way to determine whether the kids have school is to call the Sentinel direct line. A recorded message will inform you whether school is in session as normal, closed for the day or delayed as necessary. Dial 243-3669, ext 6400

**NOTE:** The schools offer five pre-arranged excused days off per year for students and many families plan their vacations around these days. But some outside school-related activities (such as: History Fairs, some field trips etc.) will require use of these days. Also if it is a bad winter many of these days will be used as snow days.

**HOME SCHOOLING** – To home school in the State of Pennsylvania generally, you must register with your local school district each year by August 1, by filing an affidavit. You may obtain a registration packet at Carlisle Area School District offices, 623 W. Penn St., Carlisle (717) 240-6800. Presently PA law does not require any administrative action with the school board unless the student is eight years old. A summary of Pennsylvania's home school law can be obtained online at <http://www.hslda.org/central/states/pa/laws.html>. Other home school information particular to Pennsylvania can be found at the Christian Home School Association of Pennsylvania at <http://www.chapboard.org/>. There are two local home school groups, CHEA, Carlisle Home Educators Association, contact Karen Crutcher, 243-7215, and Harrisburg Homeschoolers / West Shore contact, Caroline Loy 975-0786.

## COLLEGE LEVEL PROGRAMS

### THE CARLISLE BARRACKS ARMY EDUCATION AND TRAINING CENTER

The Education Center staff welcomes you to Carlisle Barracks. We offer a wide array of educational opportunities ranging from GED Preparation to Graduate Study. All counseling services are available to service members, their family members and Department of the Army civilians.

Our One Stop Test Center includes an official stocked DANTES Program and offers a wide variety of other testing opportunities from professional certification exams to proctoring of distant college tests.

During the annual County Fair, the Army Education and Training Center hosts an Education Fair. We invite 25-30 academic institutions and vocational programs to converse with the new AWC class and their family members. This event is usually held the last Friday in July at the LeTort View Community Center.

The following gives a brief description of the local colleges from which the Carlisle Barracks community takes post high school courses.

### AREA COLLEGES

Harrisburg Area Community College (HACC) - HACC is an accessible, affordable, high quality, comprehensive community college. The multi-campus college serves as a premier educational and workforce development institution. The presence of quality instruction and cutting edge technology is very relevant. 
### YOUTH SERVICES

There are a number of services available both on and off Post for the children of Carlisle Barracks. IN and AROUND CARLISLE: a number of “kid focused” businesses offer a variety of activities for children and some are even free... Check out:

## YOUTH CENTER

There is an active Youth Center on Carlisle Barracks encompassing Youth Services activities, Youth Sports and School Age Services. Some activities include: State-of-the-Art Computer Lab, Pool Tables, Table Tennis, Air Hockey, Foosball Tables, Youth Interest Books, Variety of Board Games, Video Arcade Games, 2 Wide Screen TVs, VCR, Stereo System, Limited Snack Bar. Space at the center is available, at a moderate fee, for private parties. YS has occasional off-post excursions, amusement parks, zoos and sporting events. YS holds various parties and dances throughout the year, open to all post-affiliated youth.

Youth Sports sponsors soccer and basketball programs throughout the year, in both camps and team competition. An annual membership fee (which is used for purchasing equipment and paying personnel costs incurred in youth programs) allows for unlimited use of the Center, special activities and discounts on different programs to members. Additional fees are paid for camps and organized sports. The youth center also sponsors seasonal craft projects, socials, and field trips. Membership fees are \$15.00 per child up to a maximum fee of \$35.00 per family. **This is a child and youth services fee and covers registration in the Child Development (CDC), school age services (SAS), and Youth Services (YS) programs.** \* All Youth Sports Coaches are certified by National Association for Youth Sports (NAYS.)

School Age Child-Care (SAC) programs are also held in the Youth Center before and after school. (717-245-3354/4594) and they also sponsor a Summer Day Camp. School Age Services (S.A.S.) is offered to youth ages 6 through 12 years on a space available basis. Carlisle Barracks is a pilot site for the Army School-Age & Teen project (ASA&T). The project provides SAS and Youth Services additional curriculum, materials, and staff training and as a result of this project, Carlisle Barracks is also able to offer a computer lab and homework lab. S.A.S. offers three school year program packages and two summer packages. Hourly care is also available.

**STRIKE ZONE BOWLING CENTER:** The bowling center on post offers Youth Bowling Leagues on Saturdays, which run September thru the beginning of May. Children ages 8-18 may participate and all will receive awards at the end of the year. They are sanctioned through Young American Bowling Alliance (YABA). The season begins with two Saturdays of FREE bowling for the kids. 8-12 bowl at 0930 and 13-18 beginning at noon.

Other on post facilities include: a library annex (upstairs in Anne Ely Hall), three gymnasiums, an outdoor swimming pool, tennis courts, the Youth Services court area behind the bowling center and various great playgrounds located throughout the post.

**NOTE:** Youth Curfew on / off post is the same: 15 and under - 2200, 16 & 17 - 2300: 7 days a week.

- Parking on post is limited. There are 10-minute parking spaces in front of and behind the post office. Most students walk to school.

## CHAPTER 7

### SISTER SERVICES

Carlisle Barracks a very diverse post with contingents from all services and many international regions. To help you understand Carlisle Barracks a little better, we have tried to translate the different military jargon for you.

Carlisle Barracks is a part of TRADOC (US Army Training and Doctrine Command) and the Army War College, part of DCSOPS, is a tenant of the Barracks. The AWC Commandant is the ranking officer and Commanding General on post. Under him fall the Deputy Commandant, the Ambassador of International Students, the Academic Dean and the Chief of Staff. The Garrison Commander is the overseer of Carlisle Barracks facilities including Housing, the Commissary and Exchange, Dunham Health Clinic, Child Development Center, Youth Center, ITR, etc.


Carlisle Barracks is an Army Post and as such adheres to the basic military traditions involving raising of the American flag in the morning, retreat and lowering of the flag in the evening. The bugle call signals when the flag will be lowered in the evening (usually at 5pm). The cannon near the stadium is fired and all eyes are fixed on the flag flying atop the tallest flagpole on Post, in front of Root Hall behind the stadium.

When the flag is raised or lowered military members in uniform salute. If in civilian clothes they are expected to stand at attention. All others (military in casual dress, spouses, children, foreign officers and their families) are asked to stand quietly. If driving on post at the time, you should stop the car and wait until the retreat call has ended. All occupants are expected to get out of the car, stand at attention and face the direction of the flag

Most often, newcomers to this Army tradition will encounter Retreat during our seminar softball games or coming and going to functions on Post. Please follow your fellow Army families' lead in paying reverence to our flag and encourage your children to do the same.

#### CARLISLE BARRACKS BUGLE CALLS

At one time bugle calls told what was going on within the garrison. "Reveille" sounded in the morning as a command to wake up and start a new day. "Work Call" traditionally means go back to work. "Retreat" signals lowering of the flag.

The Army War College tends to be a very social atmosphere and is a blend of many people from differing military services and countries. Please never assume that children are invited to functions and try to make child care arrangements and contacts soon after your arrival. The Child Development Center (CDC) is usually quite cooperative in their hours of operation for AWC events, offers excellent care and is quite affordable.

Remember, although Carlisle has a very small town feel and is quite friendly and safe, children **MAY NOT BE LEFT ALONE AT HOME** under the age of 12 and any child under the age of 6 should not be left alone in a car. For our International Fellows who may not be used to using childcare services, talk to others in your seminar about the ages of your children and they can be quite helpful in locating childcare. There are usually a lot of responsible teenagers among the AWC student body families. Refer to CB Regulation 608-1 which is available through ACS or CDS .


Carlisle Barracks offers a series of lectures for students and spouses dealing with important family issues. They provide information and training in finance, wellness, interpersonal skills, and much more.

**ANNAPOLIS, MARYLAND** – A beautiful, little, colonial seaport town. The many public and private colonial structures exemplify the life and architecture of the pre-Revolutionary period. The city has the only 18<sup>th</sup> century waterfront on The Atlantic coast. At tour headquarters in the Old Treasury Building on State Circle, guided walking tour information may be obtained. Tours are also available of the US Naval Academy.

**APPALACHIAN TRIAL** – The Trail runs right past Carlisle, over Rt. 11 and Trindle Rd. Brochures are available at ITR.

**BALTIMORE INNER HARBOR** – 301-837-4636. At the corner of Light and Pratt Streets in Harborplace, two pavilions contain international restaurants and cafes, colorful food markets and attractive specialty and craft shop. Also at Inner Harbor is the magnificent NATIONAL AQUARIUM – 410-576-3800 ([www.aqua.org](http://www.aqua.org)), (I-83 S to Lombard Street, turn right on Lombard, left on South Street, left on Pratt. **BOILING SPRINGS** – Six miles south of Carlisle. Boiling Springs was an 18th century iron industry settlement that became a 19th century village and recreational area listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Nearby stand the remains of the old Carlisle ironworks, the Ege-Bucher Mansion and the Ege Cemetery, dating from the 18th century. Allenberry's offers a unique variety of entertainment. In addition to a theatre for plays, the facility offers a complex consisting of restaurants, lodges, tennis courts, a swimming pool and 57 acres of wooded property.





Park Arena is the home of the Hershey Bears, an affiliate of the NHL Philadelphia Flyers. Total capacity is 8,495. Also: concerts, circuses, ice shows, wrestling, basketball and hockey. (ITR has discount tickets.) MILITARY DAYS in July, discounted admission. At Christmas, areas of the park are open with carolers, reindeer and lights. **INTERCOURSE, PA** - Amish town, lots of shops, good food, lots of buggies. PLEASE don’t take pictures of the Amish unless permission is given.

**LAKE CANYON COUNTRY** – (Tioga County) 1-800-332-6718, Tioga Ass. For Rec & Tourism, RD 1 Box 56, Mansfield, PA 16933. For water lovers, this county has seven lakes, including: scenic Tioga, Hammond & Cowanesque. Sailing, water-skiing, swimming, picnicking, camping and golf. Pennsylvania Laurel Festival in Wellsboro in June.



**LANCASTER** – The area around Lancaster has become one of the tourist hubs of Pennsylvania. There is much to see and do, from touring an Amish farm and house to the Dutch Wonderland Amusement Park. A visitor information center on US 30 at Hempstead Rd. presents a brief orientation of the area with **BROCHURES** and **FREE MAPS WHICH ARE INVALUABLE AIDS**. Try to visit one of the 7 farmers’ markets. Wheatland is the beautifully restored home of President James Buchanan. Take the Turnpike E to Rt. 283 to Lancaster. While in Lancaster, tour Anderson Bakeries, the world’s largest pretzel bakery, one block east of Rt. 30 on Rt. 340. Tours Monday thru Friday. Factory store open Monday thru Friday. Outlet shopping is everywhere and traffic can get wicked. Info book at ITR, free map and visitor’s guide.


**LEBANON** – Lebanon Valley Tourist & Visitors Bureau, Box 626-SC, Lebanon, PA 17042. Lebanon County is next to Lancaster County and is the home Lebanon bologna, among other things. Here you will find historic Cornwall Furnace (1742) where Washington directed the casting of cannons for his army. Also see Mechter’s, the nation’s oldest distillery, and Tulpehocken Manor, a 1769 mansion.

**LONGWOOD GARDENS** – 215-388-6741, this side of Philadelphia, 1½ hour drive. Superb outdoor gardens, plus huge greenhouses and conservatories provide gorgeous displays all year long. The poinsettia and Christmas display in December is magnificent. Fountains, colorful water displays, organ recitals. Admission.

**MILL BRIDGE VILLAGE & CAMPGROUND** – Paradise, PA 1-800-645-2744, Oldest, continuously operating historic Amish village - music, craft demonstrations, quaint shops.

**MOUNT GRETN**A – SE of Hershey. Plays, concerts, art festivals, pleasant location just for a drive.


**MUSEUMS** – An annual family pass for 35 museums throughout the state administered by the PA Historical and Museum Commission can be obtained by writing to the commission at Box 1026, Harrisburg, PA 17120. This will admit your whole family to any of these museums at a greatly reduced rate. You will receive a list of the museums with your pass.



**MUSHROOM FACTORY** – Kennett Square off Rt. 1 north of Wilmington, DE has become the mushroom capital of the world. Lots of stores. Near Longwood Gardens and the Brandywine River Museum. Can buy fresh mushrooms.

**NISSLEY VINEYARDS** – 737-7844, Turnpike E to Harrisburg, Rt. 441 E past Three Mile Island, 6-7 miles (past Rt. 241) to Stackstown Rd., turn left, watch for vineyard sign. Summer concerts on the grass by the river. Take a picnic, blanket and buy a chilled bottle of Nissley wine.

**PENNSYLVANIA TRAIL OF HISTORY** – 787-1019, PA Historical & Museum Commission, PO Box 1026, Harrisburg, PA 17108. Year round, 27 historical and museum commission sites and 20 locally administered sites. Battlefields, homesteads, churches, etc.



**PHILADELPHIA** – 215-597-8974, Phila. Convention & Visitors Bureau, Penn Center, 1525 JFK Blvd., Phila, PA 19102. Our state’s largest city. It is a city of both past and present. See Independence hall, the Liberty Bell and Betsy Ross’ House. Shop in the modern stores and go to a concert at the Academy of Music.

**RODALE INSTITUTE EXPERIMENTAL FARM** - 610-683-1400, 611 Siegfriedale Rd., Kutztown, PA. A 333-acre farm – a model for innovative farming & gardening systems. Learn how organic practices and regenerative agriculture produce healthy crops and ornamental gardens; all without the use of chemical pesticides, herbicides or fertilizers. Tours, special events, workshops, bookstore.

**STATE MUSEUM OF HARRISBURG** – 787-4978, 3<sup>rd</sup> & North Streets, across from the Capitol. Three-story museum filled with everything from flora & fauna to Indian exhibits and models of houses from the area, plus antiques – all pertaining to life in PA. Also a planetarium on the third floor.

**STRASBURG** – Rt. 741, southeast of Lancaster. In Lancaster County, old Strasburg claims to “have it all” – Amish farms, museums, shops and trains. You can take a 45-minute trip on a steam railroad in wooden coaches from the turn of the century. Visit the Choo-Choo Barn, a 1700 Toy Train Museum. A must for the railroad buff.

**SUSQUEHANNA VALLEY** – Susquehanna Valley Visitors Bureau, Courtyard Offices, Suite 270, Box 2, Selingsgrove, PA 17870. (Rts. 11 / 15) A lush valley, beautiful mountains. Unique shopping, dining, sightseeing, recreation, cultural events, fairs and special events.

*THREE-MILE ISLAND* – Along with all the famous sites there should be at least one that is infamous. Features a multi-screen motion picture slide presentation plus a tour. Free admission. South of Middletown on Rt. 441.

*TWO MILE HOUSE* – 243-3437, 1189 Walnut Bottom Rd., Carlisle. Seasonal events, rent for special occasions.

*VALLEY FORGE* – 215-783-1000, Valley Forge Nat'l Historical Park, Valley Forge, PA 19481. A 2,500 acre park at the site of the six-month winter encampment by the Continental Army in A self-guided tour route visits the original entrenchment lines and fortifications. Begin at the Visitor's Center at Rts. 23 and 363.

*VALLEY ENTERPRISES* – 642-8801, 855 Fairfield Station Rd., Fairfield PA. [Dwilliams@pa.net](mailto:Dwilliams@pa.net) You can pick apples, tour Duane & Linda Williams' home, have lunch on the veranda, visit the farm stand. *WATERFORD, VIRGINIA HOMES TOUR & CRAFT EXHIBIT* – October 6-8, 2000. 1¼ hours from Carlisle. Just off US 15 after you cross the VA line. Juried crafters, reenactments, food, art exhibit, children's activities, steam engines, music and entertainment.

*WHITAKER CENTRE* – 221-8201 EXT. 2504, Strawberry Sq., Harrisburg. This is a fascinating "hands on" museum where the wonders of the scientific world are learned and appreciated through touching, seeing, listening and watching.

*WINTERTHUR* - 302-888-4600 / 1-800-448-3883, Winterthur Museum & Gardens, Winterthur, DE 19735. A vast museum in a 963-acre country setting, open all year long. Henry F. Dupont's extraordinary legacy – his country estate. A collection of American antiques that is second to none and a public garden like no other. Advance reservations required, admission.

*YORK* – 755-9638, Colonial York County Visitors & Tourist Bureau, Inc., 1455 Mt. Zion Rd., York, PA 17402. The first capital of the US when the Continental Congress met from 1777-1778. The Articles of Confederation were adopted in York on 15 November. Visit the Gates House and Plough Tavern, the replica of the Colonial courthouse and the Historical Society Museum. Go to still another farmer's market. A beautiful Currier and Ives Art Gallery is also located in Downtown York. Rt. 11 N to I-83 S to York.




## SEAT BELT LAWS

- Drivers can be fined a maximum of \$25.00 for child restraint violation; \$10.00 for a safety belt violation by occupants under 18; an offender can be fined \$10.00 for seat belt violation if 18 or older.
